





I can easily see a lot of this funding crowding out, or needless competing against, the origin impetus for creating this fund, which is tangible art pieces. Much of the "new" items are transitory and easily forgotten--money wasted. I would like to see more "Light Gates" and those types of installations that Steve Napolitano once visioned as allowing MB to become a "Florence of the South Bay."
