#### PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

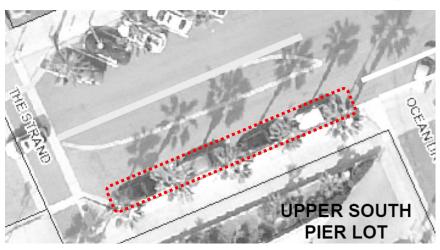

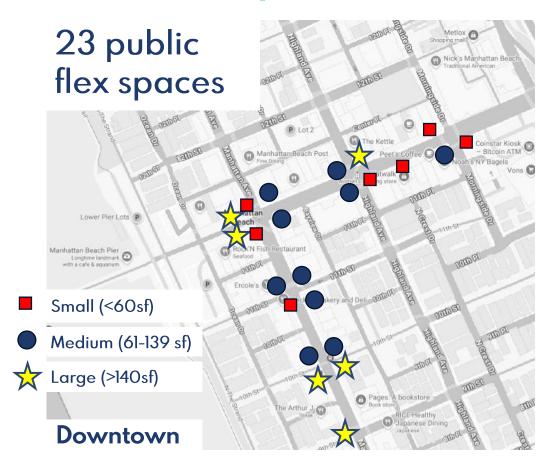

#### **Cost Estimate**

- \$13 Million
  - o Incl. engineering, construction, contingencies, etc.
  - o Downtown \$11 Million, North MB \$2 Million

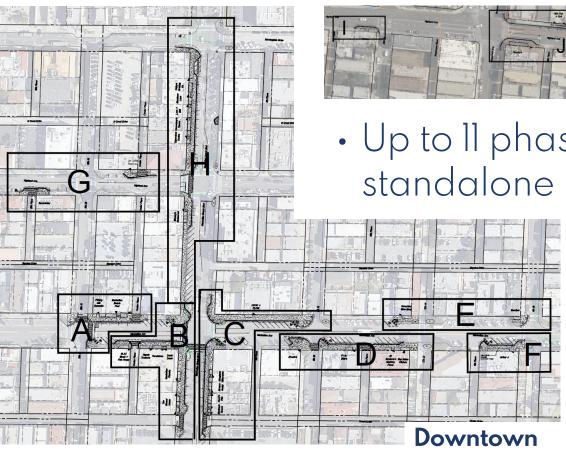
#### **Potential Funding**

#### FISCAL IMPACT ANALYSIS

- Temporary program had a positive impact on overall sales and parking revenue; both revenues declined after temporary program ended
- Proposed program is expected to have greater fiscal gains due to sidewalk use fees and fewer parking loss

Outdoor Dining Program	Temporary	Long-Term
Loss of Parking	57	7
Additional Seats (Estimate)	830	580
Net Fiscal Gain per Year	\$336K-\$447K	\$460K-\$519K

# Q&A

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- Based on parking study, field observations, and industry standards using most conservative scenario
- Recommended bundle of strategies
  - Peak parking occupancy is anticipated to be less (89%) than current levels (94%)
    - Assumed additional 181 parking demand for 580 seats with net loss of 7 on-street parking

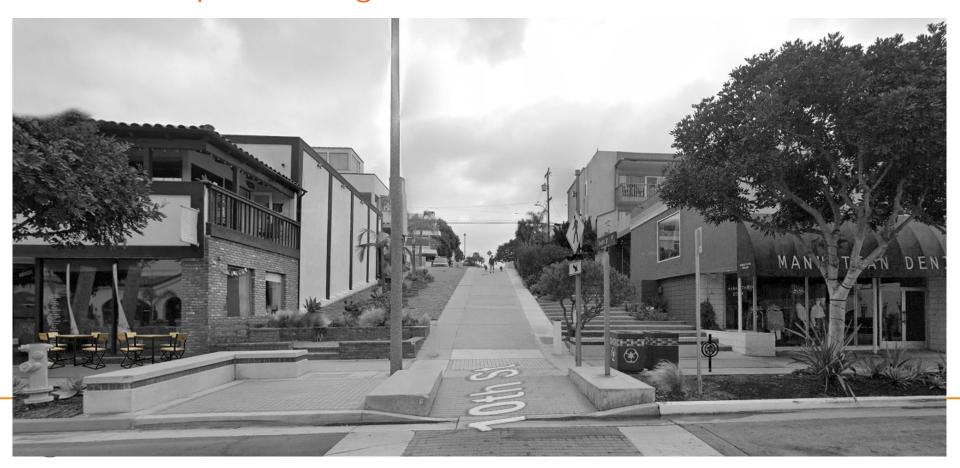

### WALK STREET OPTION 1

#### Maintain status quo

Prohibit commercial use of walk streets; sidewalk dining allowed per existing code



#### WALK STREET OPTION 2

Maintain status quo + public flex space
Same as Option 1. but with public-serving
landscape/hardscape features along the walk street

#### **Overall Recommendations**

- Eligible Businesses: Eating and Drinking Establishments only
- Permit Process: Administrative/Ministerial Permit (Incl. Alcohol)
  - Alcohol Service: Allow, subject to Alcoholic Beverage Control
- Occupancy: Allow net increase
- Trash: Adequately sized trash enclosures and service levels required,
   prior to permit issuance (Prohibit bussing stations)
- Enforcement: 3 strikes and out rule; no permit for one-year
- Permit duration: Perpetual; renewed yearly



#### **Overall Recommendations**

- Vehicle Loading: Prohibit large vehicle (i.e., 30ft or more) loading activities in residential areas and streets that are less than 36 feet in width from 11pm to 4am (Sun-Thur) and 6pm to 4am (Fri-Sat)
- Standard Design Elements
  - Leave landscaping, color palettes, and materials at the discretion of the establishment; materials to be durable and high-quality
  - Branding and identification sign prohibited on shade structures and barrier/fences

# **CODE AMENDMENT INITIATION**

#### Purpose

To reflect operational standards that have since changed with COVID and codify task force recommendations that align with current operations

#### Amendment Scope

 Existing chapters of Municipal Code and Local Coastal Program with focus on operational standards:
 e.g., Occupancy increase, alcohol service, second floor outdoor dining, live entertainment/amplified music, etc.



# DIRECTION NEEDED

#### Staff requests City Council direction on,

- Options regarding the commercial walk street corners east of Manhattan Avenue at 10th Street
  - a) Continue prohibiting commercial use of walk streets;
  - b) Same as above, but pursue public flex space improvements; or
  - c) Amend the code to allow for commercial use of walk streets limited to outdoor dining in this specific area



#### **DIRECTION NEEDED**

#### Staff requests City Council direction on,

- 2. Future direction on long-term program development
  - a) Develop plans to build out preferred vision
  - b) Proceed with no sidewalk widening as alternative
    - i. Initiate code amendments to update operational standards with task force recommendations
    - ii. Incorporate public flex space into the CIP
    - iii. Identify parking strategies to implement
  - c) Take no action
