Councilmember Napolitano read his post from Facebook regarding the current nationwide circumstances of COVID-19. Provided information that will be provided to the public regarding services and assistance.

Seeing no further requests to speak, Mayor Montgomery closed the floor to public comments.

Mayor Montgomery asked for a brief report from City Manager and Parks and Recreation Director.

City Manager Moe reported that staff is taking steps regarding the current circumstances. The Fire Chief has developed a Task Force comprised of Department Heads, Risk Manager, and other key staff members that are assisting in communicating internally and externally regarding COVID-19.

Also encouraged for the public to sign up for social media, eNotifications, and Nixle. Staff has received direction from the City Council to take certain steps to assist the business community such as extend the business license tax deadline from April 30, 2020, to June 30, 2020, notices will be sent in the mail and a press release has been prepared. City Council also delayed the implementation of User Fees that would be taking effect this week have been delayed to July 1, 2020. The City is following the State of California Governor Newsom's declaration from Sunday, March 15, 2020, and City Council will be discussing some of those items later such as closures of restaurants, bars, and limits on gathering that the City is promoting. The Los Angeles County, Department of Public and Health is providing data regarding COVID-19 cases. As of today, there is a total of 4 and last week there were 2, in Manhattan Beach. There is no street sweeping at this time. The City's EOC (Emergency Operating Center) has been activated and is currently at a level 3, tomorrow it will be moved to level 2, and it will move depending on the spread and activity of COVID-19. Currently essential staff is working onsite and others are working from home to support the City. Wanted to remind the public that staff is fully engaged and is doing everything needed to address the state of emergency.

Parks and Recreation Director Mark Leyman reported that an Older Adult Hotline (310-802-5010) has been established. It is staffed from Monday through Friday from 6:30 AM - 5:30 PM, and Saturdays and Sundays form 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM. In addition to the City's Hotline, staff is working in partnership with the BCHD (Beach Cities Health District) they have their own Hotline (310-374-3426 x256), Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM. Charlotte Barnett (BCHD), Jan Buike (City of Manhattan Beach), and Manhattan Beach Firefighter Matt Simkins are working together to provide assistance to the older adult population. Meal delivery and other essentials for seniors are also in partnership with BCHD. Rotary Club, Neighborhood Watch, and restaurants are assisting in rolling our the meal deliveries for older adults within the community. Currently Mother's is open for older adults on Wednesday's only from 6:00 AM -8:00 AM, Grow from 8:00 AM - 9:00 AM daily, and Gelson's from 7:00 AM -8:00 AM daily. Additionally noted, that this information is being distributed via mail and email from the City's lists and also provided to the BCHD subscribers.

Councilmember Napolitano asked for the information to be available for the public on the City's website and send through social media, eNotifications, and Nixle.

Parks and Recreation Director Leyman responded to the City Council questions.

City Manager Moe also noted that the City is in constant contact on a daily basis with neighboring Cities regarding COVID-19.

City Attorney Quinn Barrow noted that the three ordinances are available for the public to review at the Police/Fire Conference Room and the resolution will be available shortly.
