

RESOLUTION NO. PC 26-03

A RESOLUTION OF THE MANHATTAN BEACH PLANNING COMMISSION DETERMINING THAT THE PROPOSED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEARS 2026-2027 THROUGH 2030-2031 ARE CONSISTENT WITH THE CITY OF MANHATTAN BEACH'S GENERAL PLAN

THE MANHATTAN BEACH PLANNING COMMISSION DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Pursuant to Sections 65403(c), 65103(c) and 65401 of the California Government Code, the Planning Commission has reviewed the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Plan projects for Fiscal Years 2026-2027 through 2030-2031 as to its consistency with the City of Manhattan Beach General Plan.

SECTION 2: The City has reviewed the proposed activity for compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and determined that the activity is not a "Project" as defined under Sections 15378 (b) (4) and (5) of the State CEQA Guidelines, because the proposed action is an organizational or administrative activity that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment, and the proposed action includes the creation of government funding mechanisms or other government fiscal activities, which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment. The CIP Plan is a prioritizing and funding allocation program and cannot, and does not, have the potential to cause a significant effect on the environment. Therefore, pursuant to Section 15060(c)(3) of the State CEQA Guidelines the activity is not subject to CEQA. Thus, no further environmental review is necessary; and,

SECTION 3: The Planning Commission reviewed the analysis and recommendations of Public Works and Community Development staff, contained in their Staff Report dated April 22, 2026.

SECTION 4: Based upon the foregoing, the Planning Commission hereby determines that the City's CIP Plan projects for Fiscal Years 2026-2027 through 2030-2031 is consistent with the Manhattan Beach General Plan.
