BACKGROUND



- 2017 Caltrans Sustainability Planning Grant
 - SBCCOG & South Bay cities developed LTN routes
 - Public outreach through website and story maps
- 2021 SBCCOG resolution supporting LTN
- 2022 SBCCOG hires consultant to develop specifications
- 12/1/2022 PPIC reviewed and supported LTN
- 2023 Call for Measure M subregional fund projects



WHAT IS A LOCAL TRAVEL NETWORK?

- 243-mile network of "slow-speed" streets
- Supports zero-emission micro-mobility devices
- Neighborhood to neighborhood to destinations
- Slow-speed streets (mostly 25 mph)
- Cross major streets at traffic signals
- Shares the roadway with cars
- Directional signs and sharrows only





WHY A LOCAL TRAVEL NETWORK?


- 70% of all SB trips are 3 miles or less
- Right size your ride
- Supports Climate Action Plans
- Reduces emissions, vehicle miles and parking
- Reduces collision potential and severity
- Supports e-bike and micromobility culture





SOUTH BAY LTN NETWORK










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- Supports City's Mobility Plan


