MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day is a federal holiday in the United States for remembering and honoring the military personnel who died while serving in the United States Armed Forces.



Current:

No current event in place

- Install hardware and 3'X5" American Flags at various locations from Memorial Day through the end of July
- Wreath by Veterans Memorial
- Fallen Heroes Monument proposed

INDEPENDENCE DAY - JULY 4TH

Commemorating the passage of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. The City has placed flags throughout the City prior to the pandemic.



Current:

- Begg Pool Party
- Pre-pandemic Installed flags throughout the City

Reinstate flag placement

VETERANS DAY

Veterans Day (originally known as Armistice Day) is a federal holiday in the United States observed annually on November 11 for honoring military veterans of the United States Armed Forces.



Current:

 Annual multi-generational event at Veterans Monument

- Street closure
- Thank you Veterans banner downtown

LABOR DAY

Labor Day is a federal holiday in the United States celebrated on the first Monday in September to honor and recognize the American labor movement and the works and contributions of laborers to the development and achievements of the United States.



Current:

The City does not formally celebrate this holiday

Possible Enhancement:

 No recommended enhancements

9/11 MEMORIAL EVENT

9/11 is a federally recognized National Day of Service that happens in the United States on the anniversary of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks.



Current:

 A joint remembrance ceremony is held annually by the Police and Fire Departments

Possible Enhancement:

 Broader promotion of annual event

FLAG DAY

Flag Day commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777.



Current:

 The City does not formally celebrate this holiday

- If American flag installations are approved, they will be displayed during Flag Day
- No additional recommended enhancements

The Salute to the Troops was established in 2015 by the Parks and Recreation Commission to honor military personnel, past and present. The event now kicks off the Summer Concerts in the Park.
