I live at 568 30th street, our family has been here for 20 years. We are 4 houses up from the grass strip. Last week your Commission entertained a proposal to put in a cement bike or pedestrian path along the west edge of the grass park.

This small grass park has been used as a play yard and sports practice area for families in the neighborhood. There is no other grassy area around. However there are several concrete paths throughout the city.

Putting a concrete walkway would narrow the already narrow strip, and children aren't good at staying off paths next to play areas, so there is a hazard for bikes to zip through amid children playing and focussed on the ball instead of bike and pedestrian traffic. This would interfere with our quiet enjoyment of the park.

Dear Commission members,

I would like to echo Samir's objection. We are Samir's neigbors. We are a family of 6 and my 2 youngest boys spend their afternoons at the green patch playing soccer. Adding the cement path will create a hazard for them and for the pedestrians. Like many other kids, our boys love to play and run around. When we play soccer, we usually install the net in front of the fence so that when they shoot, worst case scenario the ball goes above the fence and we just have to walk around to grab it. If there was a cement path, we will have two choices: either we keep the same setup and the pedestrians and cyclists will have to walk around kids playing defeating the purpose of the path or we change the orientation of the net which in my mind is a non starter as the ball could now go on the streets. Additionnally, I do not understand what is the objective of adding this path in the first place, which problem are you trying to solve? This area is used as the extended backyard for families and cyclists already use it as do pedestrians without a cement path.

If you really wanted to add a path, then I would advise looking at the other side of the fence and do it there so that you do not touch the actual surface of the green patch, which is not that big compared to the number of families living in this neighborhood.
