G. PUBLIC HEARINGS

Consideration of a Use Permit amendment to modify operating hours of an existing outdoor dining area within the public right-of-way adjacent to an existing eating and drinking establishment located at 1305 Highland Avenue

Planning Manager Finestone introduced **Associate Planner Ochoa** who presented the staff report, providing an overview of the project, and making herself available for questions.

Chair Sistos asked and **Associate Planner Ochoa** confirmed that there are seven (7) outdoor tables on the sidewalk.

Seeing there were no other questions from the Commissioners, **Chair Sistos** opened the public hearing.

Residents Bob Holmes, Betsey Chambers, Kristin Drew, James Turken, James Stearns, Ray Joseph and Bob DaGiau provided public comments in-person supporting the item. Heather Deroos, Lucia Ames, and Shar Harding also provided their support via Zoom.

Chair Sistos closed the public hearing and invited Commission discussion.

Chair Sistos noted that other eateries in the area are allowed to utilize their outdoor dining areas at earlier hours, and believed the same should be granted for Uncle Bill's. She also noted that concerns related to signage and landscaping will be addressed through the approval.

A motion was made and seconded (Ungoco/Tokashiki) that the Planning Commission adopt the resolution approving the use permit amendment and finding the project exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

Study session to consider code amendments to the Manhattan Beach Municipal Code and Manhattan Beach Local Coastal Program to implement programs in the 6th Cycle Housing Element

Chair Sistos announced the item and asked if there is a staff report.

Planning Manager Finestone noted that although the item is a General Business item even though it has been identified as Planning Hearing item on the agenda. He then introduced **Associate Planner Guillean** to present the staff report.

Associate Planner Guillean presented information on the following five Housing Element programs and how the proposed amendments to the Manhattan Beach Municipal Code and Manhattan Beach Local Coastal Program serve to implement the programs, and invited questions during the presentation:

- Program 1: Accessory Dwelling Units
- Program 3: Affordable Housing Streamlining
- Program 11: Density Bonus
- Program 16: Consolidation Incentive
- Program 18: Multifamily Residential Development Standards and Streamlining in the Mixed-Use (CL, CD, and CNE) Commercial Districts.

In relation to Program 3 (Affordable Housing Streamlining), **Commissioner Hackett** expressed her interest in expanding the 100-foot notification requirement for properties, in which **Chair Sistos** concurred, especially with projects that are significant in height.

Associate Planner Guillean clarified that the 100-foot notification would occur after a decision is rendered, with the intent being to notify the public in the immediate area of the project.

Planning Manager Finestone further clarified other notification avenues that will be available to the public.

Chair Sistos asked, and Planning Manager Finestone and Associate Planner Guillean responded to, questions regarding current and proposed front-yard setbacks in the local commercial (CL) zone.

Commissioner Ungoco expressed his support for the proposed amendments.

There were no audience participants in-person and via Zoom.

Planning Manager Finestone confirmed that staff will consider the Commissioners' concerns while finalizing the proposed code language prior to returning to the Commission for formal consideration of the amendments on January 22, 2025.
