# FISCAL OUTLOOK

- Spending plan supports City Council's priorities of public safety and maintaining essential services
- Revenues are stable and growing in key areas
  - Balanced Budget with surplus of \$475,017
- City's AAA credit rating re-affirmed by S&P in 2021
- Overall financial position allows re-investment in service levels, maintenance and infrastructure corresponding with:
  - Community Priorities
  - City Council Work Plan
- Pending FEMA reimbursement submittals total \$819,000
  - Approximately \$81,000 received



# **BUDGET OVERVIEW**

- Proposed Budget includes full impacts of public safety positions added in current year:
  - Eight Sworn Positions
    - Seven in Police and One in Fire
  - Five Civilian Positions
    - Three in Police and Two in Fire
- Service Delivery Investments across all funds total \$523,242:
  - Two new full-time positions totaling \$215,207
  - Added part-time positions totaling \$258,044
  - Other staffing adjustments totaling \$49,991



# FY 2023-2024 BUDGET ADOPTION

 Resolution No. 23-0067 adopts the budget as presented in the Proposed Budget with modifications as identified in Exhibit "A":

Add Reimbursable Coordinated Integrated Monitoring Program (CIMP) administrative fees (Stormwater Fund)	\$48,567
Add one-year lease for an additional portable live-view surveillance trailer (Police Safety Grants Fund)	\$27,000
Add monthly print advertising for Older Adults programming and services (General Fund)	\$10,000



# FY 2023-2024 BUDGET ADOPTION

#### Projected General Fund Reserve Ending Balances in FY 2023-2024

20% of Expenditures Policy	\$ 18.6 million
Economic Uncertainty	\$ 4.0 million
Unreserved Fund Balance	\$ 4.0 million

#### General Fund Balance impacted by transfers out to other funds:

Transfers to support operations and one-time projects:

- CIP Fund \$1.0 million for Senior and Scout Community Center
- Stormwater Fund \$2.7 million
- Street Lighting & Landscape Fund \$293,478

Recommended Transfers per UAL Pension Policy:

- CIP Fund \$994,920
- Pension Stabilization Fund \$492,380 (Reduced for SSCC)

Pension Stabilization Fund Estimated Ending Balance in FY 2023-2024: \$3.2 million



# FY 2023-2024 BUDGET ADOPTION

- General Fund has strong revenues and balanced budget:
  - Surplus of \$475,017
  - Essential services maintained
- Investments aligned with City Council Work Plan:
  - Consultant to develop comprehensive, long-term outdoor dining & business use program
  - Historic Preservation Resource Survey
  - Comprehensive Parking Management Study
  - Redesign and repurpose slab fountain in the Metlox Plaza



### RECOMMENDATION

- Staff recommends that the City Council:
  - Conduct a Public Hearing
  - Adopt <u>Resolution No. 23-0067</u> adopting the FY 2023-2024 Operating Budget and authorizing the City Manager to take certain personnelrelated actions as identified in the Resolution
  - Adopt <u>Resolution No. 23-0068</u> establishing the Gann appropriation limit for FY 2023-2024
    - Remaining appropriation capacity: \$26,322,110
    - Available capacity as a percent of the limit: 26%
