Dear Community Member:

I would like to personally invite you to participate in several important upcoming meetings regarding the City's budget for fiscal year 2013-2014, which covers the time period of July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. These meetings will provide you, as an engaged community member, with the opportunity to participate in one of the most important roles the City Council has; allocating City funds used in providing services to our community.

The budget process begins with the City Manager presenting the proposed fiscal year 2013-2014 budget during the City Council meeting on May 7th. At that time, a high level overview of the City's proposed budget, including revenues and expenditures, will be provided. Then, the City Council will hold three budget study sessions at which time operating departments will provide information on their program initiatives, highlights, service indicators, and the expenditures needed to support those efforts. These study sessions are designed to be interactive working meetings where input from the community is encouraged.
