Over the past 3 years, have seen a marked change in homelessness in the LA area. Prior to that I lived in NYC and although the homeless community was more visible, the infrastructure was in place to provide them necessary services during the Bloomberg administrations.

As a Realtor, I have seen first hand how the Expo line has had a seriously negative impact on the Sta Monica & Venice areas. I have not seen that here in MB. Although I live in El Porto, which many expect to be disproportionately affected by transient populations of all kinds, my only interaction with homeless people has been in our civic center. I routinely walk friends to their cars when leaving Council chambers or meetings at MBPD or the Library. I'm particularly concerned about safety in the area south of the lawn which is completely out of the sight lines from the civic plaza. There always seem to be homeless people camped out there. I also routinely encounter homeless people right at the entrance to MBPD and on the flag plaza. Given that the rates of mental illness are higher in the homeless populations relative to the general population, I think I have reason to be concerned for my personal safety and that of my fellow residents.

My understanding of the homeless population is that a large percentage live with mental illness. It seems the City of LA/State of CA continue to talk about developing more (low-income) housing, yet are not addressing the bigger issue - mental health. I personally know a few individuals living with mental illness that won't accept help and/or an apartment and prefer (since their brain isn't functioning properly) to live on the streets. The mental health system MUST be improved FAST! I could be wrong, but the 'very few' homeless individuals I consistently see in Manhattan Beach seem to have some form of mentally illness. I've read that less than 10% of those living w/ mental illness are a danger to themselves or others. I haven't seen any evidence that those in MB fall in this category. This is a very sad state were in and it's very difficult to improve, although taking these people and dropping them off elsewhere is not the solution. I'm no expert on this matter but I know there are doctors and other authorities that are. This is a much bigger issue than we alone can handle. I have no answers but the compassion I feel for these people that are typically at no fault for their condition prevent me from agreeing to relocate them out of the area (unless you have the means to force them into getting help from a mental health professional... which I understand is against the law unless they are a danger to themselves or others.... Another issue to address). It'll be interesting to see how ideas within some other cities are working out... i.e. 150 tiny homes built in Seattle. Possibly the homeless will adapt better into this type of environment. Not sure... But hope so. Greatly improving the mental health system is an absolute MUST, though!

It is my understanding that solving the ills of homelessness requires people to have HOMES. The city housing experiments of the past have not worked and really only create hot beds of crime. I believe there is good evidence of success for communities that integrate low income housing amongst other housing units. New York City instituted a mandatory allocation of low income housing for new development projects. Obviously in MB we do not have that luxury being that we do not have much in the way of multi-family housing. However, we could make it our goal to try to establish a fund for the purposes of buying homes and renting them to low income families. MB has approximately 36k people in it. LA county has 10mm people and ~60k homeless persons. I would suggest that MB's housing fund pursues a goal of purchasing ~60 homes through out our city for the

purpose of low income housing. (the math is 10mm county residents / 60k homeless = 155 residents / homeless person; 36k/155 = ~232 homeless. Assuming a household has 4 people, thats ~60 homes that are needed for MB to carry its burden in homelessness issue; I also believe that we could do more:) 60 homes represents just 0.4% of our housing stock. I estimate the cost of purchase to be approximately \$75MM. A tall order to say the least BUT hey we have expensive real estate here. I also propose that we search for homeless families to begin with; after all we are a family community.

I am highly skeptical and strongly against creating and/or empowering local non-profits and advocacy groups, because my experience in Santa Monica is that these organizations are ironically often not incentivized to realize real and lasting improvements - in order to gain funding, they actually need the problem to persist. They would fight tooth and nail to stay significant, and do what is necessary to grow as organizations. Their goals are not always aligned with the goals of their communities.
