## Bruce's Beach

In 1911, Mr. George Bruce, one of our community's outstanding leaders, purchased the property and named it after his son, Bruce. Bruce, the son of George Bruce, was born in Los Angeles, California, in 1911. He was a successful businessman and a devoted family man. He was also a member of the Los Angeles City Council and served as Mayor of the City of Los Angeles from 1941 to 1945.

The land was donated to the City of Los Angeles by Mr. Bruce in 1941. The City of Los Angeles has since maintained the property as a public park.

The park was designated as a City Park and named Bruce's Beach in 1941. The park is located at the corner of 10th Street and 10th Avenue.

The Los Angeles Beach City Council declared the park as Bruce's Beach in 1941. The park is a beautiful area with a sandy beach, a playground, and a picnic area. It is a great place for families to enjoy the outdoors.

A dedication ceremony was held on the beach in 1941.
